## City Council Annual Planning Workshop Summary of 2024 Strategic Vision Session

On January 19, 2024, the City Council convened for its Annual Planning Workshop in the City Council Chambers. This session featured a presentation on the City's financial standing and future projections. The workshop also encompassed discussion on policy issues and strategies for enhancing organizational efficiency. The workshop concluded with a productive dialogue centered around the strategic vision for 2024 through the prioritization of policy initiatives.

Staff has been working to enhance the community and provide essential services in alignment with the City Council's direction and initiatives. However, at the onset of the exercise, it was characterized to the City Council that capacity limits the ability for the organization to make meaningful progress on the City Council's initiative list, while maintaining routine operations, and addressing unforeseen events.

The City Council subsequently reviewed and received updates on previously established policy initiatives. Councilmembers also proposed initiatives not listed to be considered for inclusion on the 2024 Policy Initiatives list. Following this evaluation, the City Council engaged in a priority-setting process to help align policies with available resources. Each Councilmember was provided with five stickers to allocate to initiatives. Additionally, one more sticker was provided to Council members to place on initiatives already marked with stickers. Any initiative containing three or more stickers would be considered a priority of the City Council and be the focus of staff resources in 2024. This exercise identified the following priorities:

- 1. Explore Revenue Enhancements (5 Stickers)
- 2. Solar Panels on City Facilities (4 Stickers)
- 3. Develop Funding Plan for Laguna Canyon Road Improvements (4 Stickers)
- 4. Downtown Action Plan (3 Stickers)
- 5. Artist Live/Work Affordable Housing (3 Stickers)
- 6. Explore Com. Development Opportunities to Improve Customer Experience (3 Stickers)
- 7. Performance Measures and Efficiency Programs (3 Stickers)

The City Council's revised policy initiatives list is included with this memo. Staff remains committed to advancing every policy initiative, with a primary focus on the seven items listed above. A summary of the Annual Planning Workshop will be included in the February 13, 2024, City Council agenda.
